

RECOVERY SUPPORT SERVICES 101



Contra Costa County Alcohol and Other Drugs Services Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC-ODS)

Recovery support services are important to the beneficiaries in the recovery and wellness process. As part of the assessment and treatment needs of Dimension 6, Recovery Environment of the **American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM)** Criteria, and during the transfer/transition planning process, applicable **Recovery Support Services (RSS)** will be provided.

ELIGIBILITY

- Contra Costa residents who are Medi-Cal enrolled and have completed any course of **Substance Use Disorder (SUD)** Treatment
- Clients of the Choosing Change program – clients receiving ongoing Medication-Assisted Treatment through other Narcotic Treatment Programs (NTP) are not eligible
- Provider must be linked to a Drug Medi-Cal certified location or clinic

COMPONENTS

- **Outpatient Counseling Services** in the form of individual or group counseling to stabilize the beneficiary and assess if further care is needed
- **Recovery Monitoring** including recovery coaching and monitoring via telephone/telehealth
- **Substance Abuse Assistance** including peer-to-peer services and relapse prevention
- **Support for Education and Job Skills** such as linkages to life skills, employment services, job training and education services
- **Family Support** such as linkages to childcare, parent education, child development support services and family/marriage education
- **Support Groups** including linkages to housing assistance, transportation, case management and individual services coordination
- **Ancillary Services** such as linkages to housing assistance, transportation, case management and individual services coordination


WHO CAN PROVIDE?

- A Licensed Practitioner of the Healing Arts (LPHA)
- A certified or registered Alcohol & Other Drugs (AOD) Counselor

WHAT MUST BE DOCUMENTED?

- Medical Necessity – services are provided as medically necessary
