REPORT:

At 1300 we received a call from Contra Costa Environmental Health reporting that an unknown liquid believed to be a resin had been poured into the storm drain. Environmental Health was already on scene.

At 1320 we arrived on scene and began to investigate what the unknown substance was. It is believed that the unknown substance is a clear, viscous fruit flavored syrup. It was determined that the unknown substance was not a resin after verifying that it did not present any of the known hazards that a resin would present. We then looked inside the trash bags located on the street outside the house that allegedly dump the unknown substance into the storm drain and found multiple bottles of expired Winter melon and grape flavor syrup. Environmental Health said that they would have Public Work come out to deal with the cleanup since it is not a hazardous material.
