- Article IV, Section 1.3, under "Membership Restrictions" currently states that employees of the county cannot become members of the Commission. Noted that there is a California law stating that government employees can participate as a member of the MHC
- Define section 8 7103 "financial interest" clarified
- The Mental Health Commission will be updated of proposed changes and will invite and allow members to offer input in proposed changes
- The current MHC Bylaws, will have the proposals, noted in the document ("redline")
- Once a proposal has been completed, the proposed bylaws will be submitted to the MHC for approval and then to County Counsel to be forwarded to the Board of Supervisors for approval
