Blue- Representative with Juvenile Justice Mental Health experience as well as eight African American appointees of the 17 Representative Members of the Task Force - G. Swirsding- Commented on opportunities for improvement of relations between youth, especially mentally-ill youth, and police organizations. - D. Blue- Discussed positive impact of increasing police community interaction and establishing rapport with families	Motion Introduced: G.
