# **PUBLIC COMMENT**

Jim Doyle shared the Pipeline newsletter a publication of Central Sanitation District depicting locations to dispose unused and expired prescriptions.

Jim Doyle cited a CC Times newspaper article of 11/25 indicating that the Grocery Outlet located in Richmond has applied for a Beer & Wine Alcohol License. The article mentioned that Walmart applied for a license before and was subsequently denied by the community.

Gita enthusiastically stated that she had attended the TRIBES training provided by the Center for Human Development (CHD) and added that she would like to draw from Jaime's expertise to support the Board.

Leonardo said that he received an Orientation from staff, and that at the Community Awareness Committee the group discussed AOD services for Veteran's. He requested to

Carol Lopez said that she was astonished about the positive response from the community at the last Take Back event at Brentwood PD.

Antwon shared information about Paradigm a program available to serve residents in the Richmond/Vallejo area.

V. Director's Report Haven Fearn, Director Haven Fearn referred to the Board Member whose husband is under Hospice care and wishes that the Board offers something.

Haven said that he toured the new Gayle Uilkema facility along with the bidders, this will be a 12-bed transitional housing tentatively expected to start operations in early 2013. Regarding BH integration, Haven and Jerry informed that in the last issue of the BH newsletter, Cynthia Belon indicated that we have completed one year of work and listed some organizational accomplishments, including the introduction and implementation of the COMPASS tool by community providers. Haven added that at the last AOD System of Care copies the Treatment & Prevention COMPASS versions were distributed.

Haven thanked the guest speakers and commented on the number of arrests that occur during the holiday season due to impaired driving. He added that paradoxically the numbers of arrests are down but fatalities are up. Likewise, according to the data there is as many accidents related to texting while driving

as well.

VI. Driving Under the Influence: Enforcement, Prosecution & Treatment Presentation by Concord Police Department, District Attorney and Maleah Novak AOD Consultant

Darrell Graham Introduced Panelists for the Presentation

Eric Olson, Corporal for Concord PD has been with the Traffic Bureau for 10 years. The goal is to reduce collisions through enforcement. He said that while there are less people to address this goal due to budget reductions, Concord PD has managed to support DUI enforcement and checkpoints through grants. He referred to the most efficient operation in 2011 with had multiple (10) checkpoints and were able to issue warrants and prosecute violations. The Unit works closely with Probation for Multiple Offenders.

Dana Filowsky of the District Attorney's Office stated she works with Concord PD to cross train each other for effectiveness. She explained the challenges associated with prescription drug testing as they rely on lab work that excludes prescription drugs.

Maleah Novak presented data pertaining to DUI rates and efforts aimed at State and County rates. Maleah said that recently, County AOD
