Fatima Matal Sol introduced two new Alcohol and Other Drugs Services (AODS) staff members, Keith Anderson and Juli Torok. Keith transferred from Discovery House and is now the new AB 109 counselor. Juli is a Mental Health Clinical Specialist working at Discovery House and providing support to other AOD treatment

- facilities. Recently, she provided a Mental Health Systems 101 presentation to help AOD providers better navigate the Mental Health system.
- Tom Aswad gave an update on the September National Recovery Month activities sponsored by Support 4 Recovery (S4R). September 3rd was the Third Annual Recovery Ride with approximately 40 people in attendance. September 13th was the Board of Supervisors meeting in which we went and accepted a Proclamation recognizing September as National Recovery Month. September 17th was the 12th annual Recovery Walk in Martinez. September 21st was the John Muir Recovery Health Fair which S4R tabled at along with AODS Administration. September 24th was the San Quentin Recovery Celebration. He announced that this Friday October 28th from 10-12 at the Richmond City Hall is an Affordable Housing Meeting.
- Antwon Cloird shared information about a community forum that he attended in San Pablo on October 6th that was hosted by Mental Health Services. This community forum was an opportunity to get ideas from the community about the development of the next Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Strategic Plan that will begin in 2017. Antwon let the Board know that he plans to attend the next two meetings, November 3rd in Pleasant Hill and December 1st in Bay Point and he encouraged other Board members to attend as well.

V. AOD Staff Report

Fatima Matal Sol submitted the Staff report in writing as requested by the Executive Committee. She made herself available for questions. She highlighted points:

- FAQ's of the Waiver were included in their Board packet and suggested that Board members familiarize themselves with it. There is also a checklist which tells the reader about when the Waiver becomes effective and what needs to take place between now and then.
- Health Services Department is applying for a Federal Grand called "Whole Person Care" which is between \$30 and \$40 million. It is already approved by the Board of Supervisors. A portion of this grant will fund a Sobering Center. This is a place where inebriates sober up. The average time that a person will stay in the center is between 6 and 8 hours. We will place

approximately 10 Substance Abuse Counselors in the facility. The center functions as a diversion program from jail and hospitals; this is not a place where AOD treatment occurs. In addition, there will be Community Support Workers driving around and bringing clients to the facility, and Mental Health Clinicians working at the center. We are looking at Central County as a place to support the entire County..

Fatima also distributed an opinion survey.
 The purpose of the survey is to provide feedback to staff to help us better assist the needs of the Board.

She added that a recent assessment found that Section 8 is not being used as intended, and that 3 Coordinated Care Centers have been created in central, east and west county where centralized assessments for housing will take place.

Tom Aswad informed the Board that unfortunately Peet's corporation has changed their fundraising protocol and as a result, S4R lost 1/3 of their annual budget. The training program at San Quentin on November 4th will have a cap and gown presentation for the 3rd group of newly trained AOD counselor interns. Tom mentioned a recent article in the San Francisco Chronicle citing figures released by the Department of Corrections showing that out of 919 prisoners who received drug treatment only 141 were re-imprisoned which is 15.3%. He said that the local recidivism rate is approximately 45% so the program is doing great. Tom was happy to report that with the S4R housing grants

over the last 36 months are coming in at 80% cost savings of what the county is doing. S4R has also had a 46% higher success rate as compared to the county run
