## IV. PUBLIC COMMENT

The public and Board members may comment on any agenda item of public interest within the jurisdiction of the Alcohol and Other Drugs Advisory Board. (Maximum three minutes per speaker.)

- Support4Recovery (S4R), as of November 15<sup>th</sup>, has housed 27 men, women and children in 2017 and there are two more men coming into housing on December 1<sup>st</sup>. Tom thanked Catherine Taughinbaugh and Anne Sutherland M.D. for contributing toward the *Recovery on the Runway* event that S4R hosted in partnership with Macy's. He also thanked Michael Collins for attending such event. S4R will sponsor an Alumni event in March and Tom solicited Board participation.
- Nabila Sher reported that on October 28<sup>th</sup> during the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) sponsored Take Back day in Richmond, 60 pounds of unwanted and unused prescriptions were collected. Nabila added that the City of Richmond is considering allowing a marijuana cultivation business to operate on Carlson Blvd. The Alcohol, Marijuana and Prescription Drug (AMPD) Coalition is particularly concerned because of the high crime rate in this location.
- Antwon Cloird further clarified that the area that Richmond would like to allow marijuana cultivation is an already drug infested location with a large homeless population. He also said that starting January 1, marijuana businesses will begin to be licensed.

#### X. NEW BUSINESS

Alcohol License Initiatives. Troy's Club 642 First Street, Rodeo, CA 94572. On Sale. Department of Conservation and Development meeting discussion.

Nabila Sher, Program Coordinator for the Alcohol, Marijuana and Prescription Drug (AMPD) Coalition, reported that she attended a hearing on Troy's Club at the Department of Conservation and Development (DCD) on Monday November 6<sup>th</sup>. Nabila spoke in opposition to Troy's club being granted a license because it is in violation of the Deemed Approved Ordinance (DAO) given the close proximity to a church. DCD staff denied the license request.

# VI. AOD Staff Report

Fatima Matal Sol gave the AOD Staff Report verbally this month. Below are the main points from her report:

- The City of Richmond would like to redevelop the area of Richmond where the BAART methadone clinic is currently located so Alcohol and Other Drugs Services (AODS) is assisting in the process of looking for a new location for BAART.
- On November 8<sup>th</sup> the El Sobrante Municipal Advisory Council (MAC) met to discuss the

- new proposed location for the BAART clinic and the community was in attendance to voice their concerns with this proposed new location.
- Mark Messerer, AODS Program Manager, conducted a Drug Medi-Cal Waiver Documentation training to all Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Treatment Providers.
- Starting in November, AODS will meet with community based providers to review the provisional rates in preparation for rate renegotiation with the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) at the end of the fiscal year.
- The Health Services Department (HSD) has had difficulties with finding a location for the Sobering Center. By the end of November HSD is required by DHCS to have a location identified, or else the funds shall be returned. On Thursday November 16th there would be meeting with Supervisor Mitchoff to discuss alternative locations in Central County. Following this meeting they would also meet with the Chief of Police of Concord.
