IV. PUBLIC COMMENT

- Victor Ortiz reported that he attended the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors meeting on April 24th where the Proposed Marijuana Regulatory Framework was discussed. He stated that the Board and the Department of Conservation and Development (DCD) are working against a set of complex and interesting challenges in the regulation process. He added that there was a lot of organized resistance at the

attended the Board of Supervisors meeting along with Guita Bahramipour. She was impressed with DCD's work and the level of community outreach they conducted. She also reported that they discussed the AOD Advisory Board meeting on February 28th where the framework had been presented. Finally, she commented that they included information about approaching the AOD Advisory Board when DCD receives marijuana business applications, similar to the process that is being done with alcohol licenses.

• Tom Aswad informed that Support4Recovery (S4R) is hosting their Alumni Strong Event in Concord on Saturday, April 28th at 6pm. Tom also announced that Mr. Harold Parsley, former AOD Advisory Board member, passed away. He stated that on September 18th S4R will be at the Board of Supervisors requesting a proclamation declaring September as National Recovery Month and he will ask that the meeting be held in honor of Mr. Parsley. Tom stated that he learned about programs offered for free through John Muir Hospital and they are interested in bringing their services to the different treatment programs.

Fatima Matal Sol submitted the Staff report in writing as requested by the Executive Committee. She made herself available for questions. She highlighted the following points:

- Formally welcomed Dr. Moore to the Advisory Board.
- She stated that there was a large group of organized individuals at the Board of Supervisors meeting that had very well thought out talking points that spanned issues related to marijuana from home sales, youth use to air quality.
- Included in the staff report there is data on treatment admissions comparing the past three fiscal years and the different levels of care. She reported that the data shows there is no decrease in the number of people that have been served since the Drug Medi-Cal Waiver Implementation.
- She commented that there was confusion amongst the providers about whether or not they were able to make referrals to the Access Line, if clients showed in their facilities, which led to a decrease in the number of clients served at the beginning of the Fiscal Year, and added that the numbers are improving.
- She reported that she was approached by Supervisor Andersen has expressed interested in updating the County's Social Host Ordinance to include Marijuana. The

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update process included the formation of a workgroup comprised of various stake holders. The first meeting involved reviewing ordinances by other cities and counties, and deciding what information we would like to include in our county ordinance.

 Finally, Fatima shared the data obtained from 211 about referrals made to the Access Line as well as other treatment providers as requested by Guita. The data shows that during FY 16-17 there were 366 referrals on the 211 line to the Access Line, compared to 423 referrals from July 1, 2017 to April 2018.

Anne Sutherland M.D. reported that the Executive Committee did not meet.

Anthony Segovia reported that the Community Awareness Committee did not meet.

Catherine Taughinbaugh reported that the Programs and Services Committee did not meet, however, the committee accompanied Fatima Matal Sol and Trisha Seastrom to a "meet and greet" activity at the Ozanam Center. She reported that during site visit they met with 14-16 women who reported that the counselors are now doing a lot more paperwork and spending less time with them then in the past. They also heard reports that the clients are no longer doing the "fun things" like arts and crafts. because it is not allowed under the Drug-Medi Cal Waiver. Catherine reported that the overall tone was very positive and everyone seemed appreciative for the treatment services they were being provided.
