Dialogue with Cynthia Belon	The following issues were noted: Cynthia shared the history of the Integrated System of Care with the following programs: Alcohol and Other Drugs, Mental Health Administration and the Homeless Program (Behavioral Health Division in Health Services) Initial announcement by Dr. Walker in April May –initial meeting held with a group of stakeholders (informal dialogue) Stakeholders were chosen from amongst the formal groups that exist within the three systems: Mental Health Commission, Drug Abuse Advisory Board, Homeless Advisory Board, Contractor's Alliance, Local 21, Local 1 and consumers within each of the three systems of care were chosen to be representatives Home Base a non-profit organization has provided in the past, onsite consultation and technical assistance to the Homeless system of care, over the past 11 years.
