Behavioral Health Issues • EPIC Tapestry Demonstration • Optum Update 	 Access Line was the pilot for the EPIC Tapestry program (electronic health record) which rolled out 4/11/16 and replaced paper phone logs. Electronic documentation of contacts with consumer, called Customer Relationship Management (CRMs), to more efficiently review the history of calls and referrals. Utilization of "pools" for automated routing of CRMs and more effective work management/tracking. Tapestry allows Access Line to share access to the consumer's history of mental health/medical referrals for better care coordination with Primary Care Providers. Tapestry has enhanced reporting capability on timely access to care for purposes for program development and evaluation, as well as for State Reporting requirements. Currently developed data-tracking instruments for program evaluation and for implementation of outreach efforts by a Community Support Worker, including a Consumer Satisfaction Survey. 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	 Optum is the after-hours (5PM – 8AM) answering service which went live on April 1, 2016. Calls made during holidays, weekends, and after hours to Optum. Prior to the rollout, the after-hours calls were routed to PES. The following business day a report with stats is then sent to Access Line, which then gets converted into a CRM in Tapestry.
