#### Stay Healthy

#### See your doctor

- Get blood, urine, and pap smear tests
- Keep vaccinations up to date
- Control any current medical condition
- Talk about medicines and vitamins you are taking
- Talk about family planning options

#### See your dentist

- Brush and floss at least twice a day
- So Gum disease may cause babies to be born early and/or have low birth weight

#### Keep your body healthy

- Take a daily multivitamin with 400 micrograms (mcg) of Folic Acid
- Exercise, eat well, and maintain a healthy weight
- Don't smoke and stay away from secondhand smoke
- Don't drink alcohol or use other drugs

#### Take care of yourself

Ask for help if you feel anxious, sad, depressed, stressed, or are being hurt in your relationship

#### Presumptive Eligibility (PE)

#### Presumptive Eligibility:

- Sknown as PE
- Immediate, <u>temporary</u> Medi-Cal for low-income pregnant women
- Lets you see your doctor right away while you wait for your formal Medi-Cal approval
- Lasts a minimum of 30 days

#### You qualify for PE if you:

- Think you are pregnant
- Permanently live in California, regardless of your immigration status
- Have limited income
- Don't have health insurance or have a high deductible

#### PE provides:

- Free pregnancy tests
- Prenatal care
- Prescription drugs for your Pregnancy
- Abortion and miscarriage services

#### PE does not provide:

- Emergency care
- Labor and delivery
- Inpatient care
- Family planning
