H1N1 Vaccine Update

The CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices has recommended the following groups be targeted for vaccination:

- Pregnant Women
- People who live with or care for children younger than six months of age
- Health care and emergency medical services personnel
- Persons between the ages of six months through 24 years of age
- Persons 25 to 64 years of age who are at higher risk because of chronic health disorders or compromised immune systems.

If you intend to provide this vaccine and have not yet registered, please register today at www.calpanflu.org. If you are a CCHP-contracted PCP and do not plan on providing this vaccine, please let us know.

To date we understand this vaccine will be distributed in Mid-October or maybe sooner and will be distributed in order of registration. Health Plans Applaud Governor Signing Bill to Protect Healthy Families Enrollment

Statement from CAHP Board Chair Howard A Kahn on AB 1422

"With the swipe of a pen, the future for hundreds of thousands of California's kids is much brighter today. Their families can breathe a sigh of relief as a result of Healthy Families health coverage being saved.

Without the Legislature passing and the Governor signing AB 1422, families would have faced long waiting lines or worse, no services at all. Our already crowded emergency rooms would have been the only place these children could turn to for care. Or they would have squeezed even sicker adults out of equally crowded clinics.

During these tough economic times, the nation's largest state could not afford to eliminate access to health care for children. During this time of hope for reform of our health system, the nation's largest state could not send a message of denial to the nation.

Thankfully, we no longer have to worry about what will happen to our kids next year."

Health Plans that manage Medi-Cal members accepted a 2.35% tax until January 2011. Because of this tax, the Healthy Families program has been saved for another year. More than 600,000 children in California will not lose their health care coverage. As part of this new legislation, premium and co-pays will increase November 1, 2009 for some Healthy Family Members.



Flu Updates

CCHP advises Members to get their Immunizations

In September 2009, CCHP sent our annual “flu season” letter to all CCHP members. In this letter we stressed the importance of getting immunized. CCHP has strongly encouraged our members to contact their Primary Care Provider to schedule an appointment for their Flu Shot. In this letter to members, CCHP recommended all members that meet the criteria receive the seasonal flu and the H1N1 vaccine this year. The high-risk table below was also part of the letter.

CCHP will not reimburse flu shots given at local pharmacies or other flu clinics. This year our Public Health Department has changed the delivery system of the Flu vaccine clinics for the general public. This year there will be free vaccine clinics throughout the County in November. Information on these free Public Health Flu Clinics is listed on page 4 of this bulletin.

Pharmacy and Therapeutics Update

The Pharmacy and Therapeutics committee at CCHP reviewed the efficacy, safety, cost and/or utilization of the following therapeutic categories/medications at the September 4, 2009 meeting. The changes are expected to be effective the week of October 20th, 2009.

Hyperparathyroidism Agents	Oral Bisphosphonate Agents	ACE Inhibitors
ACE Inhibitors with Hydrochlorothiazide	Low Cost Injectables	Insulin Quantity Limits

The committee approved ***addition*** of the following to the Preferred Drug List (formulary):

Altace[®] (ramipril) capsules added to formulary (tablets remain non-formulary);
Humulin[®] N, 4 vials/month quantity limit removed.

The committee approved ***deletion*** of the following to the Preferred Drug List (formulary):

Actonel[®] (risedronate). Generically available Fosamax[®] (alendronate) will remain the preferred orabispophosphonate. Patients currently on Actonel will be given notice and 90 days to make the transition.

The following were reviewed and ***prior authorization criteria*** approved or updated (remain non-formulary):

The Health Plan has reaffirmed its criteria on off-label drug use and doses exceeding FDA approved limits. Supporting documentation such as clinical studies will be needed to support these prior authorization requests. The Health Plan has the right to confer with a specialist in the field of medicine for which the prior authorization is being requested. The decision rendered by the consulting specialist may serve as the basis for the Health Plan's decision.

FYI/REMINDERS:

Clinical Pearls:

Did you know the cost of insulins you may be prescribing? Here are some monthly cost comparisons to the Health Plan (at 50 units daily) that we hope will help you choose the most cost-effective form for your patients:

Humulin R = \$42.45, Humalog = \$118.20, Novolog = \$147.15, Humulin 70/30 or N = \$42.45, Lantus = \$131.55, Levemir = \$112.95

CCHP found that on our list of top drugs by costs, various dosages of Advair[®] and Crestor[®] were high. We encourage the use of generically available inhaled corticosteroids (i.e. QVAR[®], Flovent[®]) and Statins (simvastatin, pravastatin).

340B reminder: there are 10 Rite Aids and 12 Walgreens pharmacies in our 340B network.

We encourage use of these pharmacies in order to save the County money. BHC/HCCI patients are still restricted to the 12 340B Walgreens pharmacies.

SelectCare is a Medicare Advantage Special Needs Plan offered by Contra Costa Health Plan. It is designed for Medicare beneficiaries who are also enrolled in the California Medi-Cal program.
