### Proposed Medi-Cal Reductions

The Governor's proposed California Budget in May is a very dismal one for Medi-Cal patients. The proposed cuts will be difficult for patients because they will be expected to pay co-pays. The cuts will also be difficult for providers who will then have to collect co-pays and can suffer bad debt from poor patients who are unable to pay. In addition there are restrictions placed on the number of medications that can be ordered in a month and physician visits in a year.

#### Possible Budget Cuts

##### Co-pays

- \$5 physician visit
- \$3-\$5 pharmacy
- \$50 emergency services
- \$100 per day up to max of \$200 for in-patient hospital stay
- \$5 dental visit



##### Restrictions

- 6 drugs per month
- 10 physician visits in a year

Medi-Cal managed care plans would have their capitation monthly payments reduced by these amounts (above) even though as regulated managed care plans, we would, of course, be expected to provide all medically necessary care.

Equally challenging for our Medi-Cal patients would be the severe impact of the elimination of CalWorks that is the State's main "welfare-to-work" plan. This benefit assists families with cash benefits / employment services and child care support to help with low-income part-time jobs that have no health insurance. Luckily there are two ways these proposed budget cuts may be changed or eliminated:

1. CMS is reviewing the requested California Waiver which would bring more federal dollars to California for hospitals and Medi-Cal as-well-as mandate the current Medi-Cal FFS, Seniors and persons with disabilities (SPD) into managed care plans like CHCP. CMS may rule that the co-pays or care thresholds outlined above are too severe and prohibit California from enacting them if they want federal money.
2. This week the Assembly Democratic Budget proposal was announced. The Democrats plan to reject the Governor's budget cuts and instead plan to "securitize" \$9 billion dollars of future revenues in what's called a recycling fund and use those proceeds to back bill the cuts proposed by the Governor. Jobs would be created and an oil severance tax used to pay for the debt. This tax would be in a bill that reduces sales tax related to economic recovery. This last fact means that only a simple majority vote (not a two-thirds vote) will be needed to pass the bill.

There will be more debates and possibly compromises this summer prior to a Budget. We expect a late Budget this year, August or possibly September, due to this conflict. As soon as Medi-Cal benefit changes are confirmed, you will be notified.

We will remain hopeful that one of these options either CMS or the new Democratic Plan will be successful to protect the care of and proper reimbursement for that care for Medi-Cal patients and CCHP members.

**Please Note For Our Medi-Cal Members:** According to Medi-Cal guidelines, transportation to and from hemodialysis centers, "may be considered if there is sufficient documentation from the attending physician or by on-site visit that significant altered physical state pre or post-treatment medically contraindicates the use of private or public transportation". **Dialysis Transportation requires prior authorization from the Health Plan.**

## Pharmacy and Therapeutics Update

The Pharmacy and Therapeutics committee at CCHP reviewed the efficacy, safety, cost and/or utilization of the following therapeutic categories/medications at the June 4th, 2010 meeting. The changes are expected to be effective the week of July 20, 2010.

ARB and ARB Combination Products	Ophthalmic Fluoroquinolones	Vaginal Estrogen Products
Pancreatic Enzyme Products (Lipase/Protease/Amylase)	Oral Diabetic Agents: DPP-4 Inhibitors	Diabetic Injectables: Byetta, Symlin, and Victoza
Benign Prostatic Hyperplasia Products	Hydrocortisone Acetate and Pramoxine Products	Provigil and Nuvigil

The committee approved **addition** of the following to the Preferred Drug List (formulary):

- Vagifem®(estradiol) 10 mcg tablets. Vagifem® 25 mcg were already covered.
- Creon® (lipase/protease/amylase) and Zenpep®(lipase/protease/amylase). (All previous Pancreatic Enzyme Products prior to 4/28/2010 were not FDA approved and are no longer manufactured, though existing supplies are still available until they run out).
- Zypram®(hydrocortisone/pramoxine) cream.
- Ciloxan®(ciprofloxacin) 0.3% ophthalmic solution.

The committee approved **deletion** of the following to the Preferred Drug List (formulary):

- No changes were made.

The following were reviewed and **prior authorization criteria** approved or updated (remain non-formulary):

- Zymar®(gatifloxacin) and Vigamox®(moxifloxacin). Criteria now allows for ophthalmologist to get PA approval if written for an FDA approved diagnosis.

### FYI/REMINDERS:

- Walgreens will be using our **text pagers** to notify prescribing providers in the event the pharmacist has questions about a prescription. Providers will be paged with the 10-digit pharmacy phone number followed by the patient's 8 digit DOB. Please return the call and give the pharmacy the birth date. They will use that information to find the specific question they have for you. This service should be minimally intrusive to you, and yet will help get your patient their Rx promptly.
- 340B reminder: there are 10 Rite Aid and 12 Walgreens pharmacies in our 340B network. We encourage use of these pharmacies in order to save the county money. BHC/HCI patients are still restricted to the 12 340B Walgreens pharmacies.

### SelectCare News

**SelectCare** is a Medicare Advantage Special Needs Plan offered by Contra Costa Health Plan. It is designed for Medicare beneficiaries who are also enrolled in the California Medi-Cal program. ## Advice Nurse Telephone Triage Program



The Advice Nurse Telephone Triage Program is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week including holidays to all Contra Costa Health Plan (CCHP) members regardless of their CCHP Benefit Program. Providers may refer their **CCHP** patients to this service after the close of business or on weekends and holidays.

Advice Nurses triage the member according to his/her reported symptoms and determine the appropriate level of care. All Advice Nurses are Registered Nurses experienced in telephone triage and in providing multi-lingual services.

Advice Nurses use computerized medical protocols that are tailored to community –needs and resources. Medically approved guidelines assist the Nurses in identifying high-risk situations to ensure that members are appropriately directed to immediate care as needed.

Services include but are not limited to the following:

- Monitoring conditions meeting stay-at-home criteria
- Guiding members to recognize significant changes in symptoms
- Answering questions regarding medications
- Referral to appropriate level of needed care when services are needed outside regular hours of provider operation (including urgent care appointments when appropriate based on the severity of the symptoms)
- Provide standing orders for uncomplicated medical conditions such as: uncomplicated urinary tract infection, conjunctivitis, impetigo, etc).
- Verifying member eligibility and addressing benefit related questions **afterhours**.
- Non-English speaking language capabilities of up to 140 languages

A copy of the nurse's documentation is faxed to the patient's Primary Care Provider within 24 hours of the call.

Patients are advised to call the Advice Nurse back if their symptoms worsen and/or seek medical care at an Emergency department if symptoms are emergent.


