

WHAT DOES CCHP MEMBERSHIP LOOK LIKE IN 2016? By Patricia Tanquary, CEO

The continued increase in membership residing in East County has been dramatic and is true for all members whether commercial or Medi-Cal. Today, 43% of all members live in East County; 28% live in West County; and, 27% live in Central County. This disparity is true for CCRMC and CPN. The recession and reduced costs of dwellings in East County will continue this trend.

This geographic distribution also exists for the 31,000 members we assign to **Kaiser** as well with their percentage of members living in East County at **43%**, but West County are slightly higher at **33%**, followed by **24%** living in Central County.



The difference between adults and children has also altered dramatically over the last five years such that 62% of our members (excluding those assigned to Kaiser) are adults and only 38% are children under 19 years. This ratio used to be reversed prior to SPDs and Medi-Cal expansion adults joining CCHP. Our CCHP members assigned to Kaiser still have more children (56%) than adults (44%) since so many Healthy Families children (7,000) were transitioned back to Kaiser two years ago. The primary language spoken for all members is still English, followed by Spanish.

Warning Against Misuse and Abuse of Opioids

This Health Advisory is being issued to bring attention to an alarming trend and national epidemic of misuse and abuse of prescription opioids and sedatives. As our communities and families face the devastation of loss associated with addiction and misuse of these prescription medications we call attention to the need for health care professionals to be aware of the scope of this epidemic and new guidelines for prescribing.



Nationally, each year, prescription narcotics result in more fatal overdoses than heroin and cocaine combined. Add to this that the second leading cause of fatal overdoses are prescription sedatives medicines like Xanax and Ativan, and we are compelled to recognize and address the unintended consequence that may result from the misuse of these medications. Parallel with this trend is a resurgence in overdoses related to heroin abuse.

Data from the California Department of Public Health reveals that there were 53 accidental drug overdose deaths in 2003 in Contra Costa County. In 2008 there were 84 and in 2013 there were 113. Of profound concern is the trend that underlies these occurrences. What we are experiencing in our County is, tragically, mirrored across the Nation. Information from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reveals that the death rate from drug overdose has more than doubled since 2000 and on a national level has claimed the lives of nearly 500,000 individuals during this same time period. In 2014 there were 47,055 deaths from drug overdose, more than any previous year on record. Drug overdose has now replaced automobile accidents as the number one cause of accidental death among individuals age 25-64. http://www.cdc.gov/mmwr/pdf/wk/mm6450.pdf

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, prescription opioid sales in the United States increase by 300% between 1999 and 2010. CDC Vital Signs MMWR 2011:60(43); 1487-1492. Between 1999 and 2013 the number of deaths attributed to opioid pain relievers had increased by 400%, https://www.cdc.gov/nchs/deaths.htm

A Call to Action:


Counties, health systems and community partners across the greater bay area are galvanized in their efforts to address this epidemic. Closer to home, the Alameda-Contra Costa Medical Association together with local public health agencies, health insurers, community partners and health care provider organizations are calling for Emergency Departments, Urgent Care Centers and Primary Care clinicians to adopt a set of guidelines for prescribing opioids. These guidelines are intended to help balance the need for the treatment of pain with the very real risk of drug dependency, abuse and addiction. Adult Immunizations Update



As a contracted provider for CCHP, the plan fully expects that you will provide vaccination services to our adult members. With that said, the plan realizes that there may be times when a certain vaccine is unavailable for administration in the office. For this reason, CCHP has expanded vaccination services available at Walgreens and Rite Aid stores throughout the county. Effective May 1st, 2016 the following vaccines will be available to all CCHP members age 19 and over as a pharmacy benefit:

Contra Costa Health Plan Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee

The CCHP P&T committee last met on 4/8/2016 – highlights of the meeting are below:

Changes to the Preferred Drug List (PDL):

- Removal of prior authorization (PA) requirements for duloxetine prescriptions for duloxetine may now be filled without prior authorization, and are limited to #60 capsules per 30 days (includes all strengths: 20mg, 30mg, and 60mg).
- Invokana (and Invokamet) have been added to the PDL step therapy with metformin is required (if step therapy is met, claim will pay without PA. If step therapy is not met, then a PA will be required).
- A clarification on diabetes test strips:
 - ♦ Members using insulin are limited to #150 strips per 30 days.
 - ♦ Members with gestational diabetes are also limited to #150 strips per 30 days.
 - Members who are not using insulin and are not pregnant are limited to #100 strips per 90 days.

Effective 6/1/2016:

TrueTest glucose test strips and TrueResult glucose meters will no longer be manufactured. CCHP will be coordinating a change to the new product TrueMetrix. Letters will be sent to members and pharmacies in Mid-April. CCHP will also work with the Epic team to update the order sets. Naloxone is still carved out for MediCal members. For commercial plan members on chronic opiate
therapy, naloxone is a covered product. Walgreens has agreed to supply (free of charge) a nasal
atomizer to any CCHP commercial plan member who presents a prescription for a naloxone pre-filled
syringe. CCHP is working with the Epic team to assure that the order sets are in place for the proper
formulation of naloxone.

Changes to the PDL will be effective May 2016

Prior Authorization Requests:

On average, CCHP receives >1000 prior authorization requests per month. 40% of the prior authorization requests that are received by the plan are unnecessary (the patient isn't covered under CCHP, the drug is already covered on the PDL, there is already an authorization in place, etc.).

Unnecessary prior authorization requests needlessly bog down the healthcare system and waste the time of medical office and pharmacy staff. CCHP is asking that providers review the PDL and/or use one of the numerous tools available to view the CCHP Preferred Drug List (as outlined below). Providers may also call the CCHP pharmacy unit directly with any formulary-related questions. Working together we can increase the effectiveness and timeliness of the PA program.

There are numerous ways to view the CCHP Preferred Drug List:

CCHP updates the Preferred Drug List (PDL) formulary after each quarterly Pharmacy & Therapeutics Committee meeting. CCHP invites and encourages practitioners to access each update through the following means:

Evaluation & Management Consult Coding for Claims

New Patient

A new patient is defined as one who has not received any professional services from a physician or physician group practice (same physician specialty) within the previous 3 years, e.g., evaluation and management (E/M) services, surgical procedures or other face-to-face services.

- Physicians in the same group practice of the same specialty are to bill and be paid as though they were a single physician.
- Physicians who are of a different specialty may bill and be paid without regard to their membership in a group.

Established Patient

An established patient is one who has received professional services from a physician or a physician in the same group practice of the same specialty within the previous 3 years.

• If a physician is on call or covering for another physician, a patient's encounter will be handled the same as if the unavailable physician were there.

CHDP Billing Instructions



For dates of service 8/1/2015 and later, CCHP has discontinued use of the PM-160 form for CHDP services and now should be receiving **all billing for CHDP services on a CMS 1500 billing form**.

For CHDP services we expect to see a "well visit" diagnosis billed.

For dates of service prior to 10/1/2015: **V20.2 (ICD-9)**For dates of service 10/1/2015 and later: **Z00.129 (ICD-10)**

(If other diagnosis are billed the claim may be pended for review.)

All VFC vaccines given must be billed with a "SL" modifier.

(Vaccines billed with a "SL" modifier are paid at \$0, and should have a billed amount of \$.01)


The vaccine administration fee will be paid on code 90471 only, with correct quantity. (Payment will be at the CHDP rate x units billed, regardless of billed amount and quantity billed should be 1 for EACH ADMINISTERED VACCINE - not based on vaccine components.)

If additional justifiable office visits or other non-CHDP services are billed on the same day, they should be on a separate CMS 1500 form with a modifier "25" applied on the office visit code and have a separate diagnosis if applicable. Also, CCHP is requesting that providers add "CHDP" in box 19 on the CMS 1500 form for all CHDP services billed. When manually billing, often times multiple CMS 1500 forms must be used to accommodate all CHDP services billed. When billing on multiple forms please send together and at the same time.
